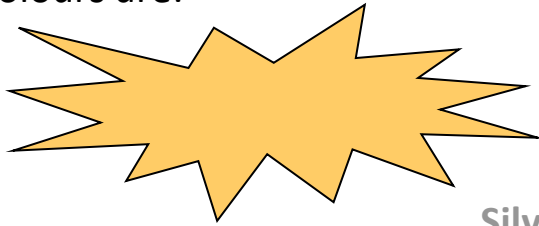

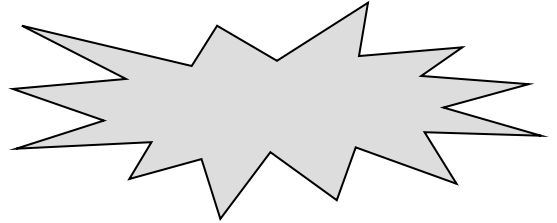

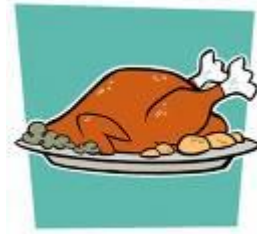

How you can help your child:-

Suggestions as to how you can support your child at home to develop in the six areas of the nursery curriculum during December.

Personal, Social & Emotional development

Encourage 'gentle hands' when they are playing with toys or with their family and friends. Talk to your child about people who have no homes and how we should help them, especially at Christmas time.

Language Development

Recite our Christmas rhyme with your child. Read different versions of the story 'The Gingerbread Man' and ask your child to recall who ran after it, who did he meet first, last?

Early Mathematical Experiences

Draw attention to, match, recognise or name the colours gold and silver and star shapes in the everyday environment. When wrapping presents show and talk about the different patterns and look for things indoors and outdoors that also have patterns on them. Compare the size / weight of presents and use the words – big, small; heavy, light.

The Arts

Make some Christmas cards with your child – glue on gold tinsel or silver tin foil. Sing our Christmas songs with your child. Listen to Christmas music and encourage your child to shake a bunch of keys in time to the rhythm.

Physical Development & Movement

Encourage your child to zip/unzip, button/unbutton their coat by themselves. Go to the park and have a go on all the play equipment.

The World Around Us

Take your child into town, talk about what you see, hear, smell and why everyone is busy. Play 'feely' games – holly, tinsel, gingerbread man or wrap up a familiar toy - guess what it is by talking about the size, shape, weight, smell or how it feels.
